

## **San Bernardino Superior Court Traffic/Infraction Amnesty Program**

The one-time Statewide Traffic/Infraction Amnesty Program established under Senate Bills 85 and 405 will be in effect at the San Bernardino Superior Court from October 1, 2015 through March 31, 2017. The Amnesty Program is intended to provide relief to eligible individuals by reducing their unpaid fines at least 50% and restoring their driver licenses.

Those interested in applying for Amnesty can do so beginning Thursday, October 1, 2015 by presenting a completed Participation Form to the Court. The Participation Form will be available at the following courthouses: San Bernardino Justice Center, Rancho Cucamonga Courthouse, Fontana Courthouse, Victorville Courthouse, Barstow Courthouse, Joshua Tree Courthouse, and Juvenile Delinquency Court. On-site application is required. Participation Forms that are mailed in will not be accepted; as payment is required to process the amnesty eligible case.

### **Eligibility Requirements**

- ✓ The citation or case is filed with the San Bernardino Superior Court;
- ✓ The individual failed to appear or failed to pay on a case that was due on or before **January 1, 2013 and** the last payment made was on or before **September 30, 2015**;
- ✓ The person does not owe victim restitution, under Penal Code Section 1202.4 (f), on **any** case within the county where the violation occurred;
- ✓ The person does not have **any** outstanding misdemeanor or felony warrants within the county where the violation occurred.

### **Not Eligible for Amnesty**

- Parking tickets, reckless driving, and DUI offenses.
- Misdemeanor or felony cases.

The Superior Court will collect an Amnesty Program fee of \$50 payable to the Court. The Department of Motor Vehicles will also charge a \$55 driver's license reinstatement fee.

**Note: Acceptable forms of payment are cash, debit, and credit. The Court will not be accepting personal checks. Please be prepared to make a 10% down payment or payment in full on qualifying case(s).**
